We do know the number of students who are taking 15 or more credits and the number of returning students is increasing, so I believe that will move us toward our goal of a graduation rate of 40% in 4 years, 50% in 5 years and 55% in six years.

Accolades

Sharon Neet, D.A., professor of history, presented a paper, "Two Histories of the Ruskin Utopia: A Study in Contrasts," at *Brandon* University's Northern Great Plains History *Conference*, held September 24-27 in Brandon, Manitoba, Canada. The paper is part of her larger study of the socialist propaganda publications of J. A. Wayland and reform movements in pre-World War I America.
